CONVERSATION GUIDE

The Trinity is an often-misunderstood characteristic of God, especially when it comes to the Third Person of the Godhead – the Holy Spirit. Some view the Holy Spirit as a third god. Others, a force instead of a person. In this series, we will discuss who He is, what His mission is, and why He can and should be worshipped.

In a series like this, it's very easy to fall into the trap of thinking the Holy Spirit is a cosmic to-do list checker-offer. Still, there is great benefit to knowing just how much we rely on Him. So, with great care in remembering the transcendence of our Lord, today we will focus on the past works and ministries of the Third Person in this divine Trinity.

QUESTIONS

- Let's first explain, as a brief review, Who the Triune God is.
- Specifically, who is the Holy Spirit?
- By now in our discussion, we've determined that the Holy Spirit isn't a mere "force" but a person, and therefore must embody all the attributes of God. What are some of those attributes?

- Our series will be fairly in-depth, and for this reason, we begin with the past works of the Holy Spirit: creation, the enablement of the apostles, and the inspiration of scripture. Although we will focus on the “big 3” what are other past works/ministries we could mention?
- Yesterday, we discussed the creative works of God. Let’s review briefly the specific role of the Holy Spirit.
- The Book of Acts could very well be titled, The Acts of the Holy Spirit. Who are the apostles? What was their role/mission/purpose? How did God the Spirit enable the apostles to accomplish their mission?
- Another great work of the Holy Spirit is enabling great men of God to write scripture. How did the Holy Spirit do this? How can we discern the difference between scripture and non-scriptural writings? Is there a supernatural component to this?
- Going back to the creative work of the Holy Spirit: We are told that believers in Christ are new creations. Is this a work of the Holy Spirit? If we want to be new creations, how do we go about it?
