Nehemiah 1:4-11: Repentance in Action

Nehemiah's posture v..4 Repentance begins with conviction

- 1. Sat down and wept and mourned for days
- 2. Continually fasted and prayed

Why was he broken? Why did he fast and pray?

According to Whitney, fasting's spiritual purposes include:

- strengthening prayer (Ezra 8:23; Joel 2:13; Acts 13:3)
- seeking God's guidance (<u>Judges 20:26</u>; <u>Acts 14:23</u>)
- expressing grief (<u>1 Samuel 31:13</u>; <u>2 Samuel 1:11–12</u>)
- seeking deliverance or protection (<u>2 Chronicles 20:3–4</u>; <u>Ezra 8:21–23</u>)
- expressing repentance and returning to God (<u>1 Samuel 7:6</u>; <u>Jonah 3:5–8</u>)
- humbling oneself before God (1 Kings 21:27–29; Psalm 35:13)
- expressing concern for the work of God (Nehemiah 1:3–4; Daniel 9:3)
- ministering to the needs of others (<u>Isaiah 58:3–7</u>)
- overcoming temptation and dedicating yourself to God (<u>Matthew 4:1–11</u>)
- expressing love and worship to God (<u>Luke 2:37</u>)

Nehemiah's Prayer v.5-11a.

- 1. A prayer of praise v.5
 - 1. Who God is... an all powerful sovereign
 - 2. What he does... He keeps promises
- 2. A plea to listen v.6a
- 3. A prayer of repentance 6b-7
- 4. A plea to remember v.8-11

Nehemiah's Position v.11b Repentance involves prayer but never ends there it leads to action.

God sovereignly placed Nehemiah in a trusted role with the King who had the authority and the resources to help rebuild Jerusalem as part of God's bigger plan to keep His promise to Israel.

A man with a burden in a position to do something took action.

Connect this with Deuteronomy 4:25-31 and 30:1-10 particularly verse 6.

Nehemiah is part of God's plan to fulfill Deut. 4:29 which is an image of Jesus who fulfills God's promise in Deut. 30:6 cf. Romans 2:25-29 and Colossians 2:11-15

God ultimately fulfills His promise in the New Covenant whereby we get a new heart so that we will love and reflect God in the earth.

Spend time reading and discussing Deuteronomy 4 and Deuteronomy 30 in connection with Nehemiah's prayer.

Choose a day this week to set aside for prayer and fasting for specific reasons appealing to God's work according to God's promises.
