### LESSON 1 – WE WERE ALL FISH ONCE

*“After John was taken, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God <sup>15</sup> and saying, The time has come, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe the gospel! <sup>16</sup> As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting nets into the sea, for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> And Jesus said to them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. <sup>18</sup> And straightaway they left their nets and followed him. <sup>19</sup> And when he had gone a little further, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother as they were in the boat mending their nets. <sup>20</sup> And right away he called them. And they left their father Zebedee in the boat with his hired servants, and went their way after him.” Mark 1:14-20 (NMB)*

The foundation of our call to be “fishers of men” is the perspective that we too were once in a position of needing to hear the good news about Jesus. Recalling our own need helps us to grasp the importance of answering God’s call to “go fish.”

- The **definition of a Christian**: One who professes belief in the teachings of Jesus Christ.
- The **definition of a Disciple**: One who accepts and assists in spreading the doctrines of another.
