## **CONNECT, REVIEW, PRAY**

~5-10 minutes

- Announce any church activities/events and handle any housekeeping for the GC
- What are you thankful for / have struggled with this week?
- How did you apply or share what we learned last week?
- How can we pray for each other?

## **ASK, LISTEN, LEARN**

- Statistics reveal that we are in a mental health crisis. 1 in 5 people experience mental illness yearly, 50% will be diagnosed with a mental illness in their lifetime, and studies show this has likely increased since the pandemic. What are ways you have seen evidence of this crisis in the world around you? In your vocation, in school, within culture at large, etc.?
- What is your personal experience with mental illness? Have you suffered with it? Has anyone close to you ever suffered with it?
- Have you sensed an increase in a personal struggle with mental illness since the pandemic?
- Usually mental illness is viewed as either completely *physical* or completely *spiritual*. What does it look like to consider mental illness as *only* a physical issue? What does it look like to *over-spiritualize* mental illness?
- How have you historically seen the church handle mental illness? How have you tended to view it?
- In what ways do you find it personally difficult to enter into the complexities of mental illness?
- God initiates relationship with us, even in our brokenness. How can we initiate relationship with someone struggling with mental illness? What are ways we can be present, be a learner, and be a fellow struggler alongside them?
- Christ offers comfort and hope, both spiritually and practically, to sufferers. How can we let someone in suffering know this? How can we do it in a way that avoids a "spiritual prosperity gospel"?
- God is continually patient with us, therefore we can be patient with those who are suffering with mental illness. How do you struggle with patience with those who are suffering?
- Do you feel that Redeemer is a safe place for sufferers? Is your Gospel Community? Are you?
- Is there anyone that the Lord has brought to your mind as we've discussed this? Take time now to pray for them. Now take a minute to send them a text letting them know you're praying for them. Follow up with them tomorrow.
