



Week 2- “Safety, Significance, and Pleasure”

In this series we will go on a journey experiencing the Psalms. The Psalms offers not just a practical, theological journey but also an experiential journey through poems and songs. The Psalms invite us to experience humanity in an honest and real way. In this week’s message we explore a Psalm that dives into one of our biggest experiences as humans and invites us to wrestle with what we look to find our value.

Read Psalm 16

1. Are you aware of the things in this world that you look to in order to feel safe, secure and significant? If not, what do you think keeps you from seeing this?
2. What is it in us that keeps us looking for significance in the things of this world?

Read Acts 2:22-32

3. If God sent Jesus to die for you, what does this say about your significance?
4. What does Jesus’ death and resurrection say about who God is?
5. Do you struggle to trust that the safety, security, and significance you are looking for are found in God? If so, why do you think that is?
6. What does it practically look like to look to Jesus and rest in what He has done for you?

7. How can this group help you discover more what it means to look to Jesus for safety, security, and significance?

This Psalm paints a clear picture of the human condition: we often seek security, pleasure, safety, and significance in things that ultimately cannot satisfy. Yet it also points us to the true answer—one that meets our deepest needs even now, amid the struggles of a broken world. As we continually embrace and re-live the Gospel, we find lasting hope and peace that is only found in Christ.
