



Week 1- “The Supremacy”

The arrival of Jesus on the first Christmas changed the world so much and people around the world celebrate it through the Advent season. In this series, we look at both the old and new testament through the words of the prophets before Jesus’ arrival, and letters written by the Apostles that show what they saw Jesus do and what they heard Him say. We will discover that everything written in the Bible points to Jesus and how Advent invites us to discover more deeply the wonder of what He has done for us.

1. What stood out to you from the message?
2. Do you and your family celebrate Advent? If so, what do you do, and what does it mean for you?

Read Philippians 2:6-11

3. According to Paul’s words Jesus didn’t cling to His own divine goodness and use it to His advantage, He humbled Himself, and laid down His life for all mankind. What does this say about who God is and His heart for you?

Read Colossians 1:15-28

4. Do you ever pause to truly think about Jesus and the depth of what He has done for you? If so, how does it impact your faith in Him?
- 5.. Discuss the reality that everything changes by simply believing what Jesus did. What does this mean for you, your life, and your story?

6. Through faith in Him you are no longer defined by your brokenness, you are defined by Christ in you. What does it look like to rest in this truth?

7. This Advent season would you be willing to invite Jesus to help you discover a deeper understanding of who He is and what He has done for you?

8. How can this group encourage you in this season?

Christianity teaches that our actions can never reach the perfection of the supreme God, it simply does not work, but if that supreme God enters our hearts everything changes. Christ came to reconcile us to Himself, so it is no wonder why Paul wrote letters to the Church to show us who Jesus is and what He has done. This Advent season would you take the time to think about the magnitude of what Jesus did for you? He didn't come to elevate Himself above you, but to humble Himself through death on the cross to reconcile you back to Himself. You simply have to believe and everything changes.
