Growing in the Son and Waiting for the Harvest

The days are getting shorter and the nights longer. The seeds and labor of days gone by are now beginning to yield its harvest. Many factors go into a successful harvest, sun, soil, water, and work. Growing takes preparation and dedication. Last month we looked at the "Know" part of our Mission Statement, "Know, Grow, Go." This month we will look at "Grow."


