Discussion Questions August 8 – 14

- 1. What is your favorite Olympic sport to watch and why?
- 2. We are considering the 7 Steps of True Repentance from Psalm 51. Last week we considered the first three steps. Review from last week:
 - Step 1: True repentance begins with an understanding of man's sinful nature (Psalm 51:5).
 - Step 2: True repentance grasps the truth that my sin is first and foremost against God (Psalm 51:3-4).
 - Step 3: True repentance is a heartfelt emotion (Psalm 51:16-17).

This weekend we considered steps 4-7. Step 4: True repentance is always based on God's great grace (Psalm 51:1-2). Read Psalm 51:1-2. Discuss the richness and importance of God's "steadfast love" and "abundant mercy."

- 3. Step 5: True repentance accepts the consequences (Psalm 51:4). The consequences of David's sin are described in 2 Samuel 12:13-23. Discuss this hard truth that even forgiven sin has consequences.
- 4. Step 6: True repentance calls on God to do major work (Psalm 51:7-11). Sin sucks the joy out of our lives. Read Psalm 51:8 and 51:12. Discuss the joy that comes with forgiveness.
- 5. Step 7: True repentance comes with a willingness to humbly teach others about the seriousness of sin (Psalm 51:12-13). Without going into details, share a time when you have helped another person in their struggles or when someone has helped you.



Bible References

Psalm 51

Create in Me a Clean Heart, O God To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David, when Nathan the prophet went to him, after he had gone in to Bathsheba.

51 Have mercy on me,^[a] O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. ² Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin! ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. ⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment. ⁵ Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me. ⁶ Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart. ⁷ Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. ⁸ Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have broken rejoice. ⁹ Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right^[b] spirit within me. ¹¹ Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit. ¹³ Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you. ¹⁴ Deliver me from bloodquiltiness. O God. O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness. ¹⁵ O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. ¹⁶ For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. ¹⁷ The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit;

a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

¹⁸ Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem;
¹⁹ then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.
