1. This week we focused on the "Eye of Expectation" in our sermon series Christmas Through the Eyes of a Child. What are you most excited about as you look forward with expectation to this Christmas season?

2. Read Mary's song in Luke 1:46-55.

This Song of Mary is known as the Magnificat. That word Magnificat is the first word in the Latin translation of Mary's song which simply means "magnify" or "exalt". Mary's song is filled with personal praise, acknowledgement of God's faithfulness to Israel in the past, and also expectation to what Jesus would do as the long-awaited Messiah.

Overall, what do you see in Mary's song that sticks out to you regarding her magnifying the Lord?

3. Read Luke 1:48-50 then Matthew 25:34. We said this weekend regardless of our circumstances:

Because of Jesus...every Christian is an eternally blessed Christian.

Do you believe that statement? If so, what causes believers at times to live as if we are not blessed? How can we practically live as "eternally blessed" believers to a watching world?

4. Read Luke 1:48-53, Matthew 23:12, James 4:6, and 1 Peter 5:5

We said this weekend:

Because of Jesus...every Christian should daily live with humble hunger for their God.

What does it practically look like for a believer to live with "humble hunger" for God? Is there an area in your life where you can admit you have not displayed "humble hunger" for God?



5. Read Luke 1:46-47

We said this weekend, at the end of the day:

Because of Jesus...every Christian's ultimate desire should be to magnify their God.

Spend some time sharing what it looks like to "magnify" or "exalt" God with all that is within us. Then share and pray for one another any areas where you need to submit to God in order to truly magnify him in that area moving forward.
