Discussion Questions August 29 – September 4

- 1. Share your fondest memory of a road trip you took either by yourself, with family, or with friends. What made that trip so special?
- 2. Read all of Psalm 121. Read again Psalm 121:1, John 16:33 and 2 Timothy 3:12. We said this weekend: *Every believer's journey will include challenges*. Every human being faces challenges. What are some challenges unique to believers that we may experience because of our faith in Jesus?
- 3. Read Psalm 121:3-6 and 2 Thessalonians. 3:3. We said this weekend: *Every believer's journey is guarded by God.* The theme of this Psalm is this Hebrew word used 6 times throughout: *Shamar* Keep, Watch Over, Guard. Remember this doesn't mean we will never face challenges, but it is the promise that God is always watching over us. How does that truth impact you today...knowing that your Heavenly Father is constantly watching over you?
- 4. Read Psalm 121:7-8, John 10:28-29 and Ephesians 1:13-14. We said this weekend: Every believer's journey has the same final destination...heaven-bound secured in Christ. How should a believer's eternal security impact their present journey with the Lord?
- 5. What challenges are you currently facing that you can share with the group this week? End by praying for one another with the confidence that: Psalm 121:1-2 "I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? ² My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."
