Discussion Questions September 12 – 18

1. If you could write a book, what genre would you write it in? Mystery? Thriller? Romance? Historical fiction? Non-fiction? (Icebreaker courtesy of Mike/Yvette Hershey's Group).

Read Acts 2:42-43. Acts 2:42 explains that the early church devoted themselves to four things. Let's think through the importance of these foundational elements.

- 2. **The Apostles Teaching.** Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17. Why is personal Bible study critical to Christian growth? How can studying the Bible in a group enhance the impact of Scripture in a person's life?
- 3. **Fellowship.** The Greek word for "fellowship" is *koinonia.* It means to have a close association that allows for meaningful connection and care. Share a time when you have experienced *koinonia.* What needs to happen in a group for *koinonia* to be experienced?
- 4. **Breaking of Bread.** In the early church, believers often shared a meal together. These were called Agape Meals (agape is a Greek word that describes the love believers have for each other). At the end of the Agape Meal, there was often a focus on the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus—what we call communion or the Lord's Supper. Two things to discuss: First, why is having a meal together such an important part of Christian community? Second, how can we always incorporate the remembrance of Jesus' work in our lives into our "breaking of bread" together?
- 5. **Prayer.** Talk about the importance of prayer in your time together. How can you make your groups time of talking to God more meaningful and significant?
