Scripture from this week's sermon: [Ecclesiastes 4:1-3](#)

1. What was your main take-away from this message?
2. Read [Ecclesiastes 4:1-3](#), [Psalm 13:1](#), and [Habakkuk 1:2-4](#). What do these passages tell us about the problem of evil under the sun?
3. There is much to consider regarding the problem of evil. There are some things that we will not be able to understand. Read [Isaiah 55:8-9](#) and [Romans 11:33-36](#). What do these passages tell us about finite people trying to understand all the works of the infinite, all-knowing, all-powerful God?
4. There are two Old Testament passages used to explain the fall of Satan from heaven. Read [Isaiah 14:12-15](#) and [Ezekiel 28:12-17](#). How do these passages explain Satan's fall?
5. Theologian Peter Kreeft is quoted in [The Case for Faith](#) (Strobel, 42) as saying, "To prevent all evil, you must remove all freedom and reduce people to puppets, which means they would then lack the ability to freely choose love." Discuss the depth of God's love to allow us the freedom to choose. Discuss how the freedom to choose creates the possibility of evil. Discuss how God remedied the problem of evil.
