#### **Religious Ritual**

Why does God desire "a broken spirit and a contrite heart" (Ps. 51:17) over sacrifices or religious rituals? How does this challenge the way people often approach God?

#### Excuses

Are there areas in your life where you tend to "minimize" or excuse sin instead of calling it what it really is? How can you begin to acknowledge it honestly before God?

#### David & Isaiah

Please read Psalm 51:17 and Isaiah's vision in Isaiah 6:1-9. Both David and Isaiah encounter their own sinfulness before a holy God. How does that awareness prepare them for renewal and mission?

#### **Revival & Mission**

David says, "Then I will teach transgressors your ways", and Isaiah says, "Here am I, send me". Why does personal revival naturally lead to a desire to reach others?
