Ice Breaker: What is your favorite pastime and why?

Ice Breaker: If you could have one answered prayer right now, what

would it be?

What helped you most from Sundays message on Acts 3 and the miracle of the beggar?

Read Acts 3:1-10. Put yourself in the pace of the beggar. What do you imagine that life would have looked like for you?

What stands out to you in Acts 3:1-10? How does this passage illustrate the power of God and the role of prayer in the life of believers?

Have you observed an answered prayer in your own life? Please explain.

In Acts 3:6, Peter says, "Silver and gold have I none, but such as I have, give I unto you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!" What can we learn from this statement about the confidence and authority we have in prayer?

Peter and John prayed for the lame man to be healed and he was. Often when we pray for things, our prayer might not be answered. Why do you think that is?

Have you ever been discouraged after praying for something and it didn't come to pass? If you're comfortable, please share that experience.

Acts 3:1-10 doesn't explicitly mention Peter and John praying for the beggar, but it's implied that their action was rooted in prayer. How does this encourage us to persistently pray for the needs of others, even when we don't see immediate results?

Have you ever known someone who you would consider a "prayer warrior" or someone who was constantly in prayer? Tell us why you thought of that person.
