

## **PSALM 78:1-8 NLT**

A psalm of Asaph.

- O my people, listen to my instructions. Open your ears to what I am saying,
- for I will speak to you in a parable.

  I will teach you hidden lessons from our past—
- stories we have heard and known, stories our ancestors handed down to us.
- We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the Lord, about his power and his mighty wonders.

## PSALM 78:1-8 NLT

- For he issued his laws to Jacob; he gave his instructions to Israel. He commanded our ancestors to teach them to their children,
- so the next generation might know them—
  even the children not yet born—
  and they in turn will teach their own children.
- <sup>7</sup> So each generation should set its hope anew on God, not forgetting his glorious miracles and obeying his commands.
- Then they will not be like their ancestors—stubborn, rebellious, and unfaithful, refusing to give their hearts to God.

Invest in the millennium. Plant sequoias. Say that your main crop is the forest that you did not plant, that you will not live to harvest. From Manifesto: The Mad Farmer Liberation Front by Wendell Berry



### ROOTS & SOIL

**MARK 4:3-8 NLT** 

<sup>3</sup>"Listen! A farmer went out to plant some seed. <sup>4</sup>As he scattered it across his field, some of the seed fell on a footpath, and the birds came and ate it. <sup>5</sup>Other seed fell on shallow soil with underlying rock. The seed sprouted quickly because the soil was shallow. <sup>6</sup>But the plant soon wilted under the hot sun, and since it didn't have deep roots, it died. <sup>7</sup>Other seed fell among thorns that grew up and choked out the tender plants so they produced no grain. 8Still other seeds fell on fertile soil, and they sprouted, grew, and produced a crop that was thirty, sixty, and even a hundred times as much as had been planted!"

## ROOTS & SOIL

#### **MARK 4:3-8 NLT**

- Footpath = those who hear the message, but are quickly snatched away by the lies of the enemy
- Rocky soil = those who respond with distracted joy, and fall away in the face of resistance
- Thorns = those crowded by worries, fears, the allure of wealth and fame, bearing little fruit
- Fertile soil = true disciples who really hear God's Word, who are willing to change and grow, who continue to bear good fruit



FRUIT NOT CONNECTED TO 175

## REFINED BY FIRE

1 PETER 1:5-7 CSB

<sup>5</sup>You are being guarded by God's power through faith for a salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. <sup>6</sup>You rejoice in this, even though now for a short time, if necessary, you suffer grief in various trials <sup>7</sup>so that the proven character of your faith—more valuable than gold which, though perishable, is refined by fire—may result in praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Refined – from the Greek "dokimázō" (dok-im-ad'-zo); <u>to</u> see whether a thing is genuine or not, as metals

# REFINED BY FIRE PROVERBS 17:3 AMPC

<sup>3</sup>The refining pot is for silver and the furnace for gold, but the Lord tries the hearts.

<u>Tries</u> the hearts – from the Hebrew "bâchan" (baw-khan'); to test, prove, try (of gold, persons, the heart, man of God)

## FAITH IN THE PROMISE

**HEBREWS 6:13-15 ESV** 

The Certainty of God's Promise

<sup>13</sup>For when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore by himself, <sup>14</sup>saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." <sup>15</sup>And thus Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise.

Patiently waited – from the Greek "makrothyméō" (makroth-oo-meh'-o); to be of a long spirit, not to lose heart
