#### This Cup: My Cup Overflows...

We are embarking on a special journey together. A journey that will take us deep into the heart of God's Word using a simple, everyday object: a cup. From the cup of suffering to the cup of blessing, this humble vessel holds powerful Biblical truths about our relationship with God and with one another. Let's open our hearts to what the Holy Spirit will teach us about the "Cups" of our lives.

5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. (Psalm 23:5)

The imagery of the overflowing cup from Psalm 23 is a symbol of God's generous care, peace, and favor. David expressed his gratitude to God for all He had done in the highs and lows life offers.

## The Shepherd's Care

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. 3 He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; <u>my cup overflows</u>. 6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever. (Psalm 23)

13 Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." John 4:13-14

# The Second Mile: Going Beyond Sunday
