The Obedience of Stewardship

A new year is upon us and the opportunities to experience and grow nearer to God have never been greater or more necessary. Following God requires faith. In faith, we follow God through “obedience”...but, what does that mean, how can I practically follow Him today, and how what difference will it make? While the world is focused on compliance and constraint, God is focused on love and alignment. Obedience should not be viewed as a way to earn God's favor, but rather as a heartfelt response to the grace already received through Jesus. Time

12 So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. Psalm 90:12

- Our days are numbered and are a gift to be used for things of eternal value.

Talents

10 As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace 1 Peter 4:10

- Every skill is a gift to serve the Kingdom and the world.

Treasure

7 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7

- Our finances, possessions, and assets don’t go with us. They are already His.

The Gospel:

Stewardship: The Goal

21 His master said to him, ‘Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.’ Matthew 25:21

The Second Mile: *Going Beyond Sunday*

Wednesday – God values you. His presence is the most valuable thing. How and why?

Thursday – Of time, talent, treasure, Gospel, creation, and relationships. Which do you guard the most? Which are you the most selfish/cling to the most? Why?

Friday – The ultimate goal of all our actions is to hear a loving God and Father say, “Well done good and faithful”. How can this goal motivate all of your decisions and generosity?
