As people who get sick and age, it is hard to imagine a future free from all the pain of this sinful world. However, when we are raised in glory, all will be made new! Our physical bodies will be imperishable. As followers of Christ, though we mourn the impact of sin on our physical bodies and our world here and now, we look forward with hope and sing, "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" (1 Cor. 15:55).

#### 1. Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-44

- Looking at verses 35-36, What were the practical problems Paul's audience was facing in view of the resurrection?
- Where have you seen God show up in extraordinary ways when you have doubted that something is achievable?
- Paul compares the resurrection of our bodies with the growth of a seed that will eventually turn into something else. What "seeds" have you planted that you are expecting to see grow?
- Christ creates heavenly bodies and earthly bodies differently to suit those specific environments. How does this encourage you when looking towards the future?

### 2. Read 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

- What is Paul noting as the differences between Adam and Christ? (v.45)
- How can we bear the image of the resurrected Christ right now?

#### 3. Read 1 Corinthians 15:50-58

- Why must humanity undergo transformation before entering the kingdom of God? (v.50)
- Knowing that Christ has defeated death, what should our view on death look like? How can our hope in the knowledge of Christ's return, give us strength in the midst of suffering?
- When have you felt discouraged by a lack of results when working? What encouragement can we take from the fact that the work we do for the Lord is not in vain? (v.58)
