## Life Group Questions SALT & LIGHT: The Witness of the Kingdom Matthew 5:13–16

Opener: Why do things seem scarier in the dark?

- 1. Make a list of all the uses for salt. How might these uses for salt translate to the Christian life?
- 2. What are some examples of the "saltiness" of Christians impacting our world today?
- 3. Read Ephesians 5:8–11; 1 Peter 2:9. How is a person brought from darkness to light? Once in the light, why is darkness still tempting?
- 4. Do you have a personal testimony of how you were brought from darkness to light? If so, please share.
- 5. Read Matthew 5:16; John 8:12; 9:5. Christians are to be the light of Christ to the world around them. How have you seen this done in your own life and/or in the life of others?
- 6. Read Philippians 2:14–16. What are some ways Christians can differentiate themselves from the world in order to be salt and light?
- 7. What are some ways Christians hide their light?
- 8. Review the Beatitudes in Matthew 5: 3–12. How do the Beatitudes provide Christians with a blueprint to be salt and light in the world around them?
- 9. Based on the Beatitudes, is the light of your life shining like a 300watt bulb? A 100-watt? A night light? Why? How can Jesus enable you to "shine brighter"?
