What are some things that can distract you from considering Jesus?
4. What do you remember about the life of Moses?  
Why was he so esteemed by the Hebrews?

#### Read Deuteronomy 34:10–12

5. Who did the Jews consider Moses to be?  
Why would the writer of Hebrews compare Jesus to Moses?
6. How do the following phrases make Christ superior to Moses?  
Moses was “faithful in” God’s house, while Jesus was “faithful over” God’s house.  
Moses was a “servant,” while Jesus is a “son.”
7. The writer uses several images to illustrate Jesus’ relationship to believers:  
the apostle  
high priest  
faithful over God’s house
