- 3. Have you ever experienced a time when you felt hopeless? How did you make it through? Did you have to make difficult decisions?

Read Ruth 1:6-13; 19-22

- 4. How open is Naomi about her situation and God's role in it? (Vss. 13, 20-21) Is it okay to be real with God in the midst of bitter situations?
- 5. Are you able to be honest and transparent with God? Why or why not?

Read Ruth 1:14-18

- 6. What do you learn about Ruth's character from these verses?
- 7. What is the value of loyalty and commitment in human relationships?
- 8. Who in your life is like Ruth, showing loyalty to you in spite of difficult circumstances? How can you be like Ruth to someone else in their struggles?
