GROUP QUESTIONS

Opening: If you had to boast about something you can do better than other people, what would it be?

Read Philippians 3:1-9

- 1. Paul talks about rejoicing in the Lord in verse 1 (cf. 2:17-18; 4:4). Since Paul is in prison as he writes this, what does his joy say about his faith in God? When you are faced with difficult circumstances, how hard is it for you to be joyful? What is most helpful in restoring your joy?
- 2. What accounts for the change in tone from verse 1 to verse 2? To whom is Paul referring with this strong language? Have you ever been warned about a false teacher or false doctrine? What is the best way to identify false teachers or erroneous doctrine?
- 3. Paul gives three traits of a Christian in verse 3. What are they? What do each of them mean?
- 4. What does it mean to "put confidence in the flesh"? In what ways were the Philippians being encouraged to put confidence in the flesh? In what ways today do people put confidence in the flesh? When are you most tempted to put your confidence in someone or something other than Christ?
- 5. Paul lists some of his accomplishments in verses 4-6. What does he say about them in verses 7-8? When you reflect on your life, can you say the same things about your achievements? Why or why not?
- 6. What does Paul say about righteousness in verse 9? Do your achievements tend to cause you to cling to Christ's righteousness or your own righteousness? Has this changed as you have grown in your faith? What can you do to continue to grow in this area?
