MEMORY VERSE

Acts 2:42—They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (ESV)

GROUP QUESTIONS

1. Who is your best friend? How did you meet?
What would your life be like without that relationship?
2. Share about a time when you either learned something from someone or you taught someone else something that was new to them.
How was your relationship with that person enriched?
3. Read Acts 2:42-47 and Acts 4:32-37 about the early church.
4. What did the early church do when they met together? (Acts 2:42)
5. How would you describe the early church?
What was happening as they came together?
6. Read Hebrews 10:23-25.
7. Why is it important for Christians to meet together?
What happens when Christians come together?
What happens (what is missed) when Christians neglect to meet together?
8. Read John 17:17-21. This is Jesus’ prayer for both his disciples and for the church.
9. What does Jesus pray for?
How important is our unity as brothers and sisters in Christ?
10. Is it easy to be unified as a community of Christians?
What does it take to be unified as a community of Christ followers?
What happens when the world sees our unity?
11. Make a commitment to be unified together in community with your brothers and sisters in Christ.
