Introduction: God's Kingdom is Infinite and Intimate

- I. God's Throne is Exalted (Psalm 47:1-9)
- A. Adoration before God's Throne (1-2)

For the director of music. Of the Sons of Korah. A psalm.

- ¹ Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy.
- B. Thanksgiving before God's Throne (3-4)
- ³ He subdued nations under us, peoples under our feet.
- ⁴ He chose our inheritance for us, the pride of Jacob, whom he loved. Selah
 - C. <u>Praise before God's Throne</u> (5-9)
 - 1. God is <u>present</u> (5) ⁵ God has ascended amid shouts of joy, the LORD amid the sounding of trumpets.
 - 2. God is **praised** in songs (6-7)
 - ⁶ Sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises.

 ⁷ For God is the King of all the earth; sing to him a psalm of praise.
 - 3. God is **proclaimed** as reigning (8-9)
- ⁸ God reigns over the nations; God is seated on his holy throne.
 ⁹ The nobles of the nations assemble as the people of the God of Abraham, for the kings of the earth belong to God; he is greatly exalted.
 - II. God's Reign is Manifest (Psalm 48:1-14)

A. In His Holy City (1-3)

¹ Great is the LORD, and most worthy of praise, in the city of our God, his holy mountain. ² It is beautiful in its loftiness, the joy of the whole earth. Like the utmost heights of Zaphon is Mount Zion, the city of the Great King. ³ God is in her citadels; he has shown himself to be her fortress.

B. In the strength of His Holy City (4-8)

- ⁴ When the kings joined forces, when they advanced together,
- ⁵ they saw [her] and were astounded; they fled in terror.
- ⁶ Trembling seized them there, pain like that of a woman in labor.
- ⁷ You destroyed them like ships of Tarshish shattered by an east wind.
- ⁸ As we have heard, so have we seen in the city of the LORD Almighty, in the city of our God: God makes her secure forever. Selah

C. In His Temple in the Holy City (9)

⁹ Within your temple, O God, we meditate on your unfailing love.

D. Throughout the Earth and to all people (10)

¹⁰ Like your name, O God, your praise reaches to the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with righteousness.

E. In the New Jerusalem and Israel. (11-14)

¹¹ Mount Zion rejoices, the villages of Judah are glad because of your judgments.

¹² Walk about Zion, go around her, count her towers,

¹³ consider well her ramparts, view her citadels, that you may tell of them to the next generation.

For this God is our God for ever and ever; he will be our quide even to the end.

III. God's Kingdom Humbles Us. (Matthew 18:1-4)

A. God humbles the proud (1-2)

 1 At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" 2 He called a little child and had him stand among them.

B. God changes the humble (3)

³ And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

C. God rewards faith and humility (4)

⁴ Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.
