God is Majestic and Glorious.

Psalm 8, Psalm 24 and Matthew 17:1-5 1-9-2022 FBCLA Part 2: "The Kingdom of God" Pastor Scott Arnold

Intro: What makes the church the community of God's Kingdom?

- I. God's Majesty and Glory is proclaimed. (Psalm 8)
- A. <u>God's Name is glorified above all.</u> (1) **1 Lord, our Lord,** how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory in the heavens.
- B. God's praise is ordained from children (2) 2 Through the praise of children and infants you have established a stronghold against your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger.
- C. God's creation humbles us. (3-4) 3 When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, 4 what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?
- D. God's redemption empowers us (5-8) 5 You have made them a little lower than the angels and crowned them with glory and honor. 6 You made them rulers over the works of your hands; you put everything under their feet: 7 all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild, 8 the birds in the sky, and the fish in the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas.
- E. <u>God's Kingdom extends to all the earth</u>. (9) *9 Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!*
- II. The Hope of God's Kingdom (Psalm 24)
- A. The hope of all the earth (1-2) 1 The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; 2 for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters.
 - B. The hope of salvation (3-6)
- 1. <u>Holiness by mercy</u> (3) 3 Who may ascend the mountain of the Lord? Who may stand in his holy place?
- 2. <u>Holiness by repentance</u> (4) **4 The one who has clean hands** and a pure heart, who does not trust in an idol or swear by a false god.

- 3. <u>Holiness by vindication of grace</u> (5) **5 They will receive blessing from the Lord and vindication from God their Savior.**
- 4. <u>Holiness by seeking God's face</u> (6) **6 Such is the generation** of those who seek him, who seek your face, God of Jacob.
 - C. The hope Christ's coming (7-10)
- 1. Be alert (7) 7 Lift up your heads, you gates; be lifted up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in.
- 2. Be aware (8) 8 Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.
- 3. Be ready (9) 9 Lift up your heads, you gates; lift them up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in.
 - 4. Be assured (10) 10 Who is he, this King of glory? The Lord Almighty he is the King of glory.
- III. A Glimpse of the King of Glory (Matthew. 17:1-5)
- A. Following Jesus' lead (1) 1 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves.
- B. Seeing the Face of God in Jesus (2) 2 There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light.
- C. Seeing Jesus as the Christ (3-5) 3 Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. 4 Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

 5 While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!"

<u>Conclusion:</u> Respond to God's Presence with faith, and experience God's power. "Don't shrink back"...Hebrews 10:36-39.
