LIVING PROPHETICALLY

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Acts 2:17-18

What is the difference between a prophet and a scribe?

David was a prophet because he earnestly desired to be in the presence of God

Read Psalm 16:9-11 - What did God show David about his future and his purpose?

What are the benefits of “saturation Bible study?”

Psalm 1:2 - But his delight is in the law of the Lord,
And in His law he meditates day and night.

What does it mean to “ruminate on Scripture?”

To live prophetically means that we are speaking what God is speaking. We are doing what God is doing.

John 5:19 (NLT) - So Jesus explained, “I tell you the truth, the Son can do nothing by himself. He does only what he sees the Father doing. Whatever the Father does, the Son also does.

To live prophetically means to speak Christ’s love and redemptive power into individuals who are broken and trapped in sin.

The prophetic lifestyle is people-oriented, not issue-oriented.

To reach the broken we need to listen without judgement.

John 3:16-17 - “For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through him.

The word “save” means to “bring to wholeness” or “to heal”

Revelation 19:10 - At this I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, “Don’t do that! I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers and sisters who hold to the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For it is the Spirit of prophecy.
