The Observance of the Lord's Supper

LUKE 22:7-34





1.

We are reminded
of the preparation
required before the
Lord's Supper.

(vss. 7–14)

⁷ Then the Day of Unleavened Bread came when the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. ⁸ Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, “Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover.”

⁹ “Where do you want us to prepare it?” they asked him.

¹⁰ “Listen,” he said to them, “when you’ve entered the city, a man carrying a water jug will meet you. Follow him into the house he enters. ¹¹ Tell the owner of the house, ‘The Teacher asks you, ‘Where is the guest room where I can eat the Passover with my disciples?’ ¹² Then he will show you a large, furnished room upstairs. Make the preparations there.”

¹³ So they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

Luke 22:7–14

Notice the points of preparation that we should consider.

- **We need to listen** “Listen,” (v. 10a)
- **We observe details of the moment, some of which we might not understand or seem strange to us.**
...he said to them, “when you’ve entered the city, a man carrying a water jug will meet you. (v. 10b).
- **We are submissive in following the Spirit wherever He may lead us.** Follow him into the house he enters. (v.10c)



Notice the points of preparation that we should consider.

- **We ask questions.** Tell the owner of the house, “The Teacher asks you, ‘Where is the guest room where I can eat the Passover with my disciples?’” (v. 11)
- **We get cleaned up!** “When the hour came, he reclined at the table, and the apostles with him.” (v. 14)

We are reminded
of the symbols of
the Lord's Supper.

(vss. 15-20)

¹⁵ Then he said to them, “I have fervently desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶ For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.” ¹⁷ Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks, he said, “Take this and share it among yourselves. ¹⁸ For I tell you, from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.”

¹⁹ And he took bread, gave thanks, broke it, gave it to them, and said, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”


²⁰ In the same way he also took the cup after supper and said, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you.

- **The presence and power of Satan.** (vss. 1-6, 21)


²¹ But look, the hand of the one betraying me is at the table with me.

- **The pride in our hearts.** (vss. 23-30) Vs. 24:

Then a dispute also arose among them about who should be considered the greatest.

- **The peril of weak faith.** (vss. 31-34) ³¹ “Simon,

Simon, look out. Satan has asked to sift you like wheat. ³² But I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail.
