Luke 1:26-38; Luke 2:4-20



Luke 2:8–14

⁸ In the same region, shepherds were staying out in the fields and keeping watch at night over their flock.⁹ Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid, for look, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people:

1. Angels: They remind us of why we, too, were created.



¹¹ Today in the city of David a Savior was born for you, who is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be the sign for you: You will find a baby wrapped tightly in cloth and lying in a manger."

¹³ Suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying:

¹⁴ Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace on earth to people he favors!



2. Mary: In the midst of uncertainty and confusion, you can trust God. Luke 1:26-31

²⁶ In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man named Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary.²⁸ And the angel came to her and said, "Greetings, favored woman! The Lord is with you.] ²⁹ But she was deeply troubled by this statement, wondering





what kind of greeting this could be. ³⁰ Then the angel told her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ Now listen: You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus.

A 3-step process that turned the improbable into the possible.

Matthew 1:18–25

²⁰...an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, don't be afraid to take Mary as your wife, because what has been conceived in her is by the Holy Spirit.²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to name Him Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins."

3. Joseph: He trusted God enough to let Him work in the lives of his loved ones.









²⁴ When Joseph got up from sleeping, he did as the Lord's angel had commanded him. He married her
²⁵ but did not know her intimately until she gave birth to a son. And he named Him Jesus.

4. **Nanger:** The manger reminds us of the harsh realities of life that Jesus faced when he entered this world. Luke 2:7

...and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.



5. Shepherds: They remind us of the side of society that is often forgotten, but God remembers.

Luke 2:8-20

Verse 8: And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.

Verse 20: The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.





6. Jesus: He is the reason for the season.

Luke 1:31–33

³¹ Now listen: You [Mary] will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of his father David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and his kingdom will have no end.
