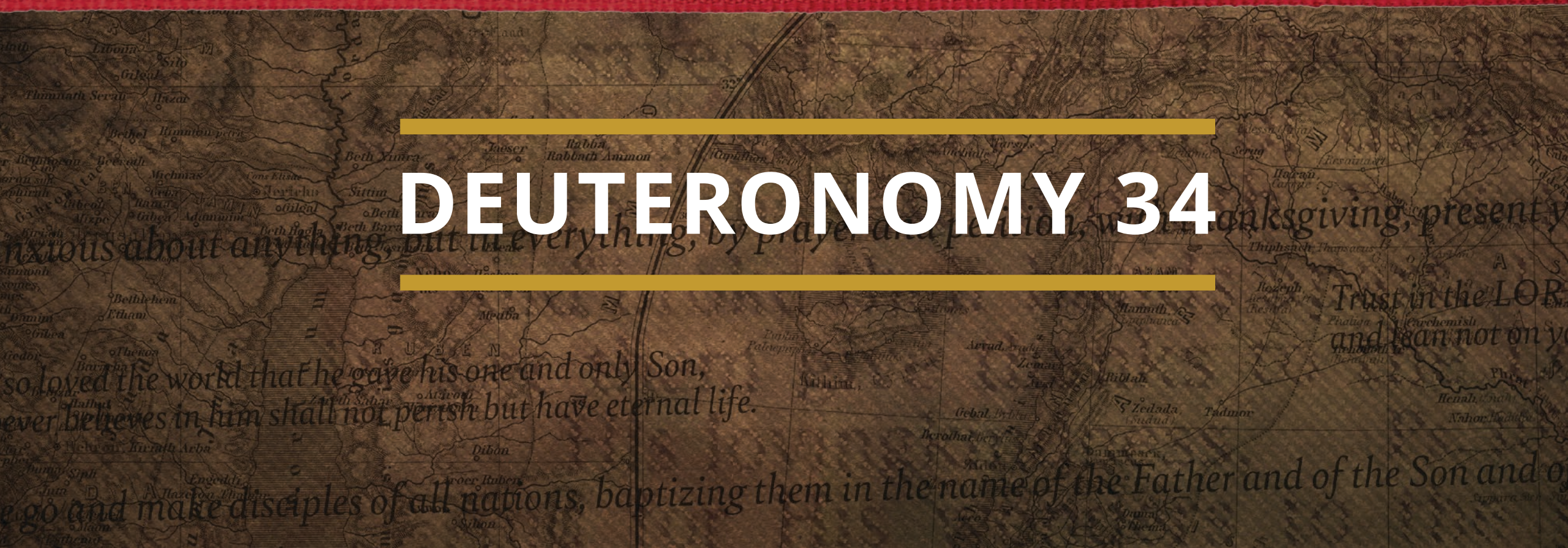




# NOW WHAT?

## DEUTERONOMY 34
