AMAZING FAITH

SERMON SUMMARY

This sermon teaches that believers are called to “fight the good fight” by growing from immature, distracted faith into a mature faith that truly trusts Jesus and focuses on what matters—people’s lives and eternity. It contrasts a lack of faith, which limits God’s work, with great faith that expects Him to move, ultimately calling Christians to deepen their trust in Jesus so they can live with purpose and help others experience His grace.

KEY POINTS

- Fight the right battles – Maturity means shifting from trivial concerns to fighting for what truly matters, like faith, relationships, and people’s eternity.
- A lack of faith limits impact – It’s not that God lacks power, but that insufficient or familiar faith can prevent us from experiencing what He wants to do.
 - You can't fight a fight worth fighting with a lack of faith!
- Believing in Jesus vs. believing Jesus – Many acknowledge Him, but true faith trusts His authority, promises, and power in everyday life.
- Great faith expects God to move – Like the persistent woman, real faith is bold, dependent, and confident that even a “crumb” of God’s power is enough.
 - Great faith is HOW you fight a fight that's worth it!
- Mature faith fights for others – As faith grows, it moves beyond self and compels us to pursue, love, and lead others into God’s kingdom.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **What are some “fights” in your life right now that may not really matter, and how can you shift your focus to what truly does?**
2. **In what areas of your life do you find yourself believing in Jesus, but struggling to fully believe or trust Him?**
3. **How can familiarity with faith (church, Bible, routines) sometimes lead to a lack of expectation for God to move?**

4. **The woman in Mark 7 showed persistent, expectant faith—what would it look like for you to have that kind of faith in your current situation?**
5. **What is one practical way you can begin “fighting for others” this week—helping someone take a step toward Jesus?**
