WORK, WORLDVIEW, AND CONFORMING

Don't be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what is the good, well-pleasing, and perfect will of God.

Romans 12:2

I have often been asked in job interviews "Where do you see yourself in five years' time?". I presume it is a question to see how ambitious you are. You can never be too ambitious! I am at an age where thankfully that is no longer asked, but if I had the opportunity to answer that question I would answer and say, "In five years' time I would like to be more patient than I am now, kinder, more generous with my time, energy and finances, more honest in my dealings with colleagues and clients, and definitely more joyful all round."
