## Jonah 2:7 [Legacy Standard Bible]

<sup>7</sup>"While my soul was fainting within me, I remembered Yahweh, And my prayer came to You, To Your holy temple.

## Matthew 6:7 [Legacy Standard Bible]

<sup>7</sup>"And when you are praying, do not use meaningless repetition as the Gentiles do, for they suppose that they will be heard for their many words.

# 1 Kings 18:26-28 [Legacy Standard Bible]

<sup>26</sup>Then they took the ox which was given them and they prepared it and called on the name of Baal from morning until noon saying, "O Baal, answer us." But there was no voice and no one answered. And they limped about the altar which they had made.

<sup>27</sup>Now it happened at noon, that Elijah mocked them and said, "Call out with a loud voice, for he is a god; either he is occupied or relieving himself, or is on a journey, or perhaps he is asleep and needs to be awakened."

<sup>28</sup>So they cried with a loud voice and gashed themselves according to their custom with swords and lances until the blood gushed out on them.

## John 9:31 (LSB)

<sup>31</sup>"We know that God does not listen to sinners; but if anyone is God-fearing and does His will, He listens to him.

## Jonah 2:1 (LSB)

<sup>1</sup>Then Jonah prayed to Yahweh his God from the stomach of the fish,

<sup>2</sup>and he said, "I called out of my distress to Yahweh, And He answered me. I cried for help from the belly of Sheol; You heard my voice.

# I. Despair - Psalm 34:15-19 (LSB)

- <sup>15</sup>The eyes of Yahweh are toward the righteous And His ears are open to their cry for help.
- <sup>16</sup>The face of Yahweh is against evildoers, To cut off the memory of them from the earth.
- <sup>17</sup>The righteous cry, and Yahweh hears And delivers them out of all their troubles.
- <sup>18</sup>Yahweh is near to the brokenhearted And saves those who are crushed in spirit.
- <sup>19</sup>Many are the evils against the righteous, But Yahweh delivers him out of them all.

<sup>8</sup>O taste and see that Yahweh is good; How blessed is the man who takes refuge in Him!

## II. Death - Jonah 2:3-5 (LSB)

<sup>3</sup>"For You had cast me into the deep, Into the heart of the seas, And the current surrounded me. All Your breakers and waves passed over me.

<sup>4</sup>"So I said, 'I have been driven away from Your sight.

Nevertheless I will look again toward Your holy temple.'

<sup>5</sup>"Water encompassed me to my very soul. The great deep surrounded me, Weeds were wrapped around my head.

## II. Death - Driven Away

יוֹעָרָן אָרָ Nigrasti – drive out; cast out; divorce

- Adam and Eve from the Garden of Eden (Genesis 3:24)
- Cain from his home (Genesis 4:14)
- Canaanites from the Promised Land (Joshua 24:18)
- Philistines from their cities (Zephaniah 2:4)
- Unrepentant Israelites from the land (Hosea 9:15)

<sup>6</sup>"I went down to the base of the mountains. The earth with its bars closed behind me forever, But You have brought up my life from the pit, O Yahweh my God.

James 4:4 (LSB)

<sup>4</sup>You adulteresses, do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity toward God? Therefore, whoever wishes to be a friend of the world sets himself as an enemy of God.

#### Matthew 6:24 (LSB)

<sup>24</sup>"No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

#### 1 John 2:15 (LSB)

## Luke 18:9-12 (LSB)

- <sup>9</sup>And He also told this parable to some people who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and viewed others with contempt:
- <sup>10</sup>"Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.
- <sup>11</sup>"The Pharisee stood and was praying these things to himself: 'God, I thank You that I am not like other people: swindlers, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector.
- <sup>12</sup>'I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get.'

# III. Dependence – Jonah 2:8-9

Luke 18:13-14 (LSB)

13"But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his chest, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, the sinner!'

14"I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other, for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

# III. Dependence – Jonah 2:8-9

Nehemiah 1:6–7 (LSB)

<sup>6</sup>let Your ear now be attentive and Your eyes open to hear the prayer of Your slave which I am praying before You today, day and night, on behalf of the sons of Israel Your slaves, confessing the sins of the sons of Israel which we have sinned against You; I and my father's house have sinned.

<sup>7</sup>"We have worked in utter destruction against You and have not kept the commandments, nor the statutes, nor the judgments which You commanded Your servant Moses.
