Meta ($\mu\epsilon\tau\alpha$): "with", "amid," "after"

Noeo ($vo \hat{\epsilon} \omega$): "think," "perceive," "understand"

Metanoeo (μετανοέω)

- Changed after being with
- Think differently after
- Change of direction
- Repentance

NOT Repentance

Dismay toward consequence: Cain

Genesis 4:13–14 (LSB)

¹³And Cain said to Yahweh, "My punishment is too great to bear!

¹⁴"Behold, You have driven me this day from the face of the ground; and from Your face I will be hidden, and I will be a vagrant and a wanderer on the earth, and it will be that whoever finds me will kill me."

NOT Repentance

Tears of regret

Hebrews 12:16–17 (LSB)

¹⁶that also there be no sexually immoral or <u>godless person</u> like Esau, who sold his own birthright for a single meal.

¹⁷For you know that even afterwards, when he desired to inherit the blessing, he <u>was rejected</u>, for he found <u>no place for repentance</u>, though he <u>sought for it with tears</u>.

NOT Repentance

Acknowledgement of sin and remorse

Matthew 27:3–4 (LSB)

³Then when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He had been condemned, <u>he felt remorse</u> and <u>returned</u> the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,

⁴saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? See to that yourself!"

Godly Sorrow vs. Worldly Sorrow

2 Corinthians 7:10 (LSB)

¹⁰For godly sorrow produces a repentance without regret, leading to salvation, but the sorrow of the world brings about death.

I. The Fruit of Repentance (Jonah 3:5-8)

Hebrews 11:6 (LSB)

⁶And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who draws near to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him.

Conversion / Change

- The change, whose source is God, always begins with a faith that is coupled with repentance.

1 Samuel 16:7 (LSB)

⁷But Yahweh said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for God sees not as man sees, for man looks at the outward appearance, but Yahweh looks at the heart."

Matthew 3:8–9 (LSB)

⁸"Therefore bear fruit in keeping with repentance;

⁹and do not suppose that you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham for our father'; for I say to you that from these stones God is able to raise up children to Abraham.

Acts 2:37-38 (LSB)

³⁷Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Men, brothers, what should we do?"

³⁸And Peter said to them, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 26:19–20 (LSB)

¹⁹"So, King Agrippa, I did not prove disobedient to the heavenly vision,

²⁰but kept declaring both to those of Damascus first, and also at Jerusalem and then throughout all the region of Judea, and even to the Gentiles, <u>that they should repent and turn to God, practicing deeds appropriate to repentance.</u>

Jonah 3:10 (LSB)

¹⁰Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way, so God relented concerning the evil which He had spoken He would bring upon them. And He did not bring it upon them.

Colossians 1:12–14 (LSB)

¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light.

¹³Who rescued us from the authority of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of the Son of His love, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Hebrews 1:2 (LSB)

²in these last days spoke to us in His Son, whom He appointed <u>heir of all</u> <u>things</u>, through whom also He made the worlds,

Romans 8:17 (LSB)

¹⁷and if children, <u>also heirs, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ,</u> if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him.

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with <u>every spiritual blessing</u> in the heavenly places in Christ,

Revelation 5:9–10 (LSB)

⁹And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are You to take the scroll and to open its seals, because You were slain and purchased for God with Your blood people from every tribe and tongue and people and nation.

¹⁰"And You made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God, and they will reign upon the earth."
