Titus 2:3-5 [Legacy Standard Bible]

³Older women likewise are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good,

⁴so that they may instruct the young women in sensibility: to love their husbands, to love their children,

⁵to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands, so that the word of God will not be slandered.

The Human Condition

- 1. All mankind has been corrupted with sin nature (Romans 5:12)
- 2. Cursed man is inclined to trust in himself and in humanity and to distrust God (Jeremiah 17:5)
- 3. Satan, the God of this age, rules the world and blinds mankind to truth/reality (2 Cor. 4:4; Ephesians 2:2)
- 4. Truth (light) is made available, but man rejects it because he is in love with falsehood (darkness) (John 3:19)
- 5. Man cannot save himself. God has to intervene (Galatians 2:21; 3:21)

Βλασφημῆται (blaspheimeitai)

LSB/CSB – Slandered

ESV - Reviled

NASB - Dishonored

KJV/NKJV – Blasphemed

NIV – Maligned

"Inaccurately representing someone we dare not misrepresent."

¹²But Yahweh said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not believe Me, to treat Me as holy in the sight of the sons of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land which I have given them." 2. How has the Word been slandered by God's people throughout history?

Exodus 16:26-27 (LSB)

- ²⁶"Six days you shall gather it, but on the seventh day, the sabbath, there will be none."
- ²⁷Now it happened on the seventh day, that some of the people went out to gather, but they found none.

Deuteronomy 8:2-5 (LSB)

- ²"And you shall remember all the way which Yahweh your God has led you in the wilderness these forty years, that He might humble you, testing you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not.
