

I'VE WITNESSED IT MIRACLES OF PHYSICAL HEALING

Psalm 77:13–14 (NIV) ¹³ Your ways, God, are holy. What god is as great as our God? ¹⁴ You are the God who performs miracles; You display Your power among the peoples.

- **Miracles are simply “God getting involved” in the affairs of man.**

Matthew 9:35 (NIV) Jesus went through all the towns and villages, **teaching** in their synagogues, **preaching** the good news of the kingdom and **healing** every disease and sickness.

5 KEYS TO YOUR HEALING

1. HOPE – YOU'VE GOT TO HAVE HOPE.

Hebrews 11:1 (NKJV) Now faith is the substance of things **HOPED FOR**, the evidence of things not seen.

Proverbs 13:12 (NLT) Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a dream fulfilled is a tree of life.

Romans 15:4 (NKJV) For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.

1 Peter 1:3 (NRSV) Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into **a living hope** through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead...

2. FACTS – YOU NEED TO HAVE THE FACTS.

Hosea 4:6 (NIV) My people are destroyed from lack of knowledge.

Isaiah 5:13 (NKJV) Therefore, My people have gone into captivity, because they have no knowledge...

1) YOUR HEALING IS ALREADY A FINISHED WORK.

Isaiah 53:4–5 (NKJV) ⁴ Surely He has borne our **griefs** and carried our **sorrows**; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. ⁵ But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, **and by His stripes we are healed.**

1 Peter 2:24 (NKJV) ...who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes **you were healed.**

2) IT IS GOD'S WILL FOR YOU TO BE HEALED.

Mark 1:40–42 (NIV) ⁴⁰ A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, “If you are willing, you can make me clean.” ⁴¹ Jesus was indignant. He reached out his hand and touched the man. “I am willing,” he said. “Be clean!” ⁴² Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.

3. FAITH – YOU'VE GOT TO HAVE FAITH.

- **Belief is knowing that God CAN do something. Faith is the conviction that God WILL do something.**

Hebrews 11:1 (NET) Now faith is being sure of what we hope for, being convinced of what we do not see.

Hebrews 11:6 (NIV) And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

Romans 10:17 (NKJV) So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Mark 11:20–24 (NKJV) ²⁰ Now in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots. ²¹ And Peter, remembering, said to Him, “Rabbi, look! The fig tree which You cursed has withered away.” ²² So Jesus answered and said to them, “Have faith in God. ²³ For assuredly, I say to you, **whoever says** to this mountain, ‘Be removed and be cast into the sea,’ and **does not doubt in his heart**, but **believes** that those things **he says** will be done, he will have whatever **he says**.” ²⁴ Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive *them*, and you will have *them*.”

4. FORGIVENESS – YOU MUST FORGIVE.

Mark 11:25 (NIV) And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins.

1 Peter 3:7 (NIV) Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, **so that nothing will hinder your prayers.**

5. PATIENCE – YOU MUST BE PATIENT.

Patience is the virtue of persevering with enduring self-control through hardship, delay, or suffering while trusting in God's timing, wisdom, and plan.

John 4:46–53 (NLT) ⁴⁶ As he traveled through Galilee, he came to Cana, where he had turned the water into wine. There was **a government official in nearby Capernaum whose son was very sick.** ⁴⁷ When he heard that Jesus

had come from Judea to Galilee, he went and begged Jesus to come to Capernaum to heal his son, **who was about to die.**⁴⁸ Jesus asked, “Will you never believe in me unless you see miraculous signs and wonders?”⁴⁹ The official pleaded, “Lord, please come now before my little boy dies.”⁵⁰ Then Jesus told him, **“Go back home. Your son will live!”** And the man believed what Jesus said and started home.⁵¹ While the man was on his way, some of his servants met him with the news that his son was alive and well.⁵² **He asked them when the boy had begun to get better, and they replied,** “Yesterday afternoon at one o’clock his fever suddenly disappeared!”⁵³ **Then the father realized that that was the very time Jesus had told him, “Your son will live.”**

Hebrews 6:12 (NIV) We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised.

Hebrews 10:35–36 (NKJV) ³⁵Therefore do not cast away your confidence, which has great reward. ³⁶For **you have need of endurance, so that after you have done the will of God, you may receive the promise:**

James 1:2–8 (NKJV) ²My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, ³knowing that **the testing of your faith produces patience.** ⁴**But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.** ⁵If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. ⁶But let him ask in faith, **with no doubting**, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; ⁸he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.
