Conversation Starters

• Have you heard things about God before that left you questioning its truth?

Discuss

Lie #1: God's love must be earned.

Truth: There is absolutely nothing you can do to make God love you less, and nothing you can do to make God love you more.

"I have loved you with an everlasting love!" (Jeremiah 31:3 NIV)

- What are some things you have tried to do to earn God's love?
- Have you ever done anything that you think God can't forgive?

Lie #2: God ignores our disobedience.

Truth: Honoring God matters. Grace and truth are inextricably intertwined.

My dear child, don't shrug off God's discipline, but don't be crushed by it either. It's the child he loves that he disciplines; the child he embraces, he also corrects. (*Hebrews 12: 5-6 Msg*)

- Are you more like Jesus today than you were a year ago? In what ways?
- What areas of life do you need to extend grace toward yourself or others?

Lie #3: God changes us.

Truth: We engage and pursue the work of spiritual growth in concert with God's work.

Let your roots grow down into him and draw up nourishment from him. See that you go on growing in the Lord, and become strong and vigorous in the truth you were taught. (Colossians 2:7 NLT)

- How are you engaging right now for spiritual growth?
- Are you inviting God to areas of your life that need changing?

Lie #4: Because I'm a Christian, God will protect me from pain and suffering. Truth: The promise of God is not a storm-free life, but the strength to stand in and through the storm.

"The Lord is close to those whose hearts are breaking...The good man does not escape all troubles – he has them too. But the Lord helps him in each and every one." (<u>Psalm 34:18-20 NLT</u>)

- What is your initial response when you encounter pain and suffering?
- Where do you turn for strength in pain and suffering?

Lie #5: God has lost control of everything.

Truth: God is in control and will have the last, final word. Which means we, as the people of God, have unflinching hope.

- Do you trust that God is in control of everything?
- How does that trust play out for you in everyday life?
