Moses is an example of realizing one's God-given responsibility even in seemingly impossible circumstances.

What can we as Christians learn from Moses' journey?

How did he choose? How did he handle insecurity?

How did he succeed through some impossible situations?

## I. Determination

Hebrews 11:24-25

- Refused
(v. 24) "By faith Moses, when he was come to years REFUSED to be called the son of pharoah's daughter."
- Chose Rather
(v. 25) "CHOOSING rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season."


## II. Evaluation

Moses chose the long view.

## III. Elimination

- Focused on Christ
(v. 26) "Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures of Egypt."
(v. 27) "Seeing him who is invisible.."
- Forsook Egypt
(v. 27) "By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king."


## IV. Continuation - Patience and Faithfulness

- Endured
(v. 27) "By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured..."
- Kept the Passover
(v. 28) "he kept the Passover, and the sprinkling of blood, lest he that destroyed the firstborn should touch them."
- By Faith Passed Through
(v. 29) "By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned."


## V. Realization

The Promise of Deliverance was Realized.
(v. 26b) "for he had respect unto the recompense of the reward."
(v. 27b) "For he endured as seeing him who is invisible."
