- 6. What hesitations or obstacles have you faced in joining or committing to a small group?
- 7. How might sermon-based small groups help in applying Sunday's message to daily life?
- 8. The pastor emphasized accountability in small groups. How can we lovingly hold each other accountable in our spiritual walks?

- 5. Identify one area of your spiritual life where you need accountability and share it with a trusted group member.
