Connect (15min) – Share refreshments.

- *What is 1 Thing You are Thankful for Today & 1 Thing We Don't Know About You Yet?
- *Read Psalm 23 and invite one person to open in Thanksgiving to God & Prayer for the Group.

Sunday Message Feedback (35-45min)

- *Speaker: Shawn Vandop Lead Pastor. Message: PERSEVERE Part 5.
- **1. COURAGE!** The dictionary defines <u>Courage</u> as the ability to do something that frightens one; strength in the face of pain or grief; latin origin = heart.
 - **a.** When you think of the theme COURAGE which stories/characters come to mind from the Bible, literature, theatre/movies, or sports?
 - b. What is one the most courageous thing you have ever done? How did that experience change you?
 - c. Talk about a time where you thought you were confident in something but ended up failing in the end.*Did you try again? *How did that experience change you or shape future decisions?
- **2.** Shawn said that "Courage in life is only as good as the confidence behind it." Do you agree? Discuss. Considering the theme of our series -- How does Courage connect with a life of Perseverance?
- 3. HEBREWS 101 -- What do you know about the book of Hebrews?
 - *Option: Watch The Bible Project Introduction to the book of Hebrews (8min on YouTube)
 - *Here is a short background on the book so your group understand the context.
 - **a.** We do not know who the Author of Hebrews is. Some believe it to be Paul but we have no conclusive evidence that we can say with assurance that it was. Which is fine because in the end the author is God. He wrote it we just don't know whose human hand he used to pen it.
 - **b.** Hebrews is a letter written to Jewish believers (Hebrews). These Jews had come to place in their faith in Jesus Christ as their Messiah but they were beginning to drift. Many were going back to what they once knew and were giving up on Jesus. That's why this letter focuses on so many things that a Jewish audience would understand. The writer speaks about priests and sacrifices and angels and Moses and the list goes on. At first glance it may not seem relevant to you and me but if you take the time to read it you will soon see that we have the exact same problem as these early believers did. Just like these Hebrew Christians We end up believing that our old ways and other ways are better than Jesus and if we aren't careful we will end up trying to find satisfaction and fulfillment in things that we will end up believing are better than Jesus.
- 4. Read Hebrews 10:32-39
 - **a.** Do you ever struggle with "giving up" on your faith in Jesus?
 - **b.** What one brief example of something (an issue or question) that initiates this struggle?
- **5. Read <u>Hebrews 10:35</u>** Shawn mentioned that the implication is that the confidence (trust) is something that you have to throw away if you don't want it. **God doesn't change we do**.
 - *Why is this important to understand when it comes to putting our confidence in Jesus?

6. Two Ways to Throw Our Confidence Away

Shawn Talked about how we can "throw away" our confidence in Christ:

a. We consider our circumstances rather than considering Christ.

*Read <u>Hebrews 12:1-4</u>

- *The word "think" (in the NLT) is translated "consider" (in the NIV) and can best be understood as "comparing." The author is challenging us to take our lives and our struggles and compare them to what Jesus struggled with and through. Take a moment and compare your struggles to Jesus struggles (make a list of what Jesus went through for us). Does it give you courage to persevere? Discuss.

 *Another way to compare your life with Jesus is to ask yourself, "Is Jesus better than what I am going through?" That is the focus of Hebrews. It is a call to settle the issue of whether Jesus is better than whatever comes your way or solution to your issues, etc.
- 1. Are you ever tempted to pick something or someone else over Jesus? Why?
- 2. How does embracing Jesus as better than anything else give us courage to persevere? Discuss.
- b. We confuse confidence in ourselves for confidence in Christ.
 - *Shawn said that "self-help" or "self-confidence" works for a while until it is tested.
 - >> How has this been true in your own life?
 - *What will be the outcome of placing all your confidence in yourself?
 - *Read Hebrews 10:19-22 How does this passage of Scripture give you confidence?

7. Read Hebrews 12:12-13

a. How does this verse encourage you? **b.** How can you practically do what it says? Discuss.

Application & Prayer (15-20min)

- 1. When we suffer and experience hardship it can be hard to see God's plan and purpose.
 - Yet, God is way more committed to our greater good and to making us more like Him.
 - a. Are you willing to invite God to use your hardships and struggles to make you more like him (Holy)?
 - b. Are you willing to stay the course and persevere and not "throw away" your confident hope in Jesus?
 - *Share with the group what you need from God in order to live with that kind of confidence.
- **PRAYER:** Break into groups of 3-4 or Men/Women to enhance the opportunity for sharing and prayer. **Option A:**

*Based on our discussion and the topic of Perseverance & Courage -- how can we Pray for you personally?

Option B:

^{*}Read the <u>Courageous Disciple Prayer</u> (on p.3) in unison as a Group & then pray for one another. (Prayer composed by Miles McPherson)
