- **3. P.R.A.Y.** (15min)
 - Read Luke 8:22-25 and use this scripture as a guide for prayer.
 - Pray Take 10min to P.R.A.Y. together. Leader time & transition to each component.
 - -- Pause (be still & focus. 2min)
- -- Rejoice & Reflect (praise & thanks. 2min.),
- -- Ask (invite & request 4min.)
- -- Yield (surrender & trust. 2min)

3. BAPTISM Basics

- *BAPTISM publicly and personally identifies us with Jesus Christ.
- *Baptism is an outward symbolic act of something powerful that has happened inside a person's heart.
- *Baptism is a public declaration of a new association illustrated through death and resurrection.
- *Baptism declares to the world that we were dead, we were buried but now we are alive!

*'Baptiso/Baptisma' is a common Greek word used to describe washing, dipping/dunking (clothes in dye), immersion, drowning, sinking (ship)...

A. Baptism is PERSONAL

- When you get baptized you are being baptized into Christ's death. Read Romans 6:3-4
- When you get baptized you are made alive in Christ. Galatians 3:26-29; Colossians 2:12-13
- *How does Baptism connect with and reflect Christ's Resurrection?
- *How has Baptism personally impacted you or others that you know?
- B. Baptism is <u>PUBLIC</u> Following Jesus is a personal decision but it was never meant to a private decision.
 - Jesus set the example by getting baptized in one of the most public places of his day the Jordan River.
 - When you get Baptized you are publicly standing with and for JESUS! Read Matthew 10:32-33
 - *Can you think of some other examples of outward/public symbols that reflect an inward (personal) commitment or experience?
 - *How have you seen, or how could you see Baptisms act as a public witness in our day?
- C. Baptism is a **Command of Christ** and a **PRIORITY** for every Christ Follower.
 - It's a command of Jesus in Scripture. It was a common practice of the early-church in Scripture.
 - Early Christians almost always believed & got baptized in the same day.
 - Read Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 2:36-41; Acts 8:12 www.openbible.info/topics/baptism
 - *Why do you think God chose water as the element used in Baptism?
 - *What promise is He making in Baptism that we are choosing to believe and receive in our lives?
 - *What is the prerequisite for Baptism?
 - *What message does your being Baptized convey that words alone cannot? (Col.2:12)
 - *Why do you think many Christians wait a long time before getting Baptized?
- 4. Since Jesus had nothing to repent of, what was the point of His Baptism? Read Mark 1:4-11; John 1:29-31; Hebrews 4:14-16

5. Reference Point

*How can Baptism be an encouraging and motivational reference point for Christ followers in their ongoing journey of sanctification and discipleship (being made whole and following Christ)?
