Connect (15min) – share refreshments.

1. This Is Us...

- a. What is <u>one</u> of your *hobbies or interests* in life (beyond your family and work)?
 (e.g. what do you do to recharge, for fun, or a challenge, or curiosity sake...)
- **b.** Describe <u>one</u> way that this activity or interest recharges or inspires you.
- 2. March Focus: Split into groups of 3-4 (or men/women)
 - "LORD, Help Me...To develop a consistent daily devotional time with You." #2020 Prayer Goals
 - a. Share a highlight from your Devotions (reading/prayer) this past week, or your plan for the month of March.
 - b. Read Zephaniah 3:17 & Pray.
 - > Invite one person to give thanks for the highlights and pray for your remaining time together today.

Sunday Message Discussion (35-40min)

*Share the reading of the Scriptures throughout the discussion.

1. Something of Great Value

- **a.** Would you rather *look art* ART or *make something* ARTISTIC? Explain why.
- **b.** What is something of great value (other than a person) that you own or have seen yourself? (e.g. *art, music or sports memorabilia, ancient artifact, treasure, a family heirloom...*)
- c. i. How is something's *Value* usually determined? Share some examples as a group.ii. Is it always subjective? Whose opinion or perspective matters the most in determining value?

2. Made ALIVE in Christ! > Read the core passage from Sunday's Message: Ephesians 2:1-10

- **a.** What initially stands out to you in this passage?
- b. What does Paul tell us about ourselves in verses 1-3?
- c. Have you ever thought of yourself as *spiritually dead*? Are Paul's words hard or encouraging to hear? & Why?
- d. Why do you think it is so important for Paul to make sure the Ephesians (and us) know this about ourselves? Paul is making it clear that without Jesus (GOD) we're "spiritually dead." The good news is that anyone can turn to God and His Word to be made "spiritually alive" again.

"In every other worldview, you find the way of being good and the way of not being bad. But in the Christian message, **Jesus Christ didn't come into this world to make bad people good. He came into this world to make dead people live.** That's the reality. We cannot attain salvation by lifting ourselves up by our own ethical standards" – <u>Dr. Ravi Zacharias</u>

e. How would you describe (to others) the process of God's Word working in us who are spiritually alive?
 *Consider these helpful verses – <u>Hebrews 4:12</u>; <u>1 Peter 1:22-23</u>; <u>John 16:13</u>.

3. Taking Shape

a. According to Ephesians 2:2 how does the Devil gain control of our hearts & lives?

- b. How do the following verses describe our part in being intentionally influenced by God?
 - Read Philippians 4:8-9; Proverbs 7:1-4; John 8:31.
 - Can you think of any ways God's influence on you has helped you influence others? If so, explain.
- c. Would you say that you relate to God as someone who is trying to SOLVE you, or the One who is SHAPING you?
 > Discuss the difference & impact of this.

4. God's Poem

One of the amazing results of God's grace can be seen in <u>Ephesians 2:10</u>, where Paul says we are God's "<u>poiema</u>" -- which is Greek for poem, handiwork, workmanship or masterpiece -- <u>created to do "good works</u>."

"The Greek word Paul chose for this sentence is "poiema," and what he had in mind is a work of masterful creativity. You can already tell that this is where we get our English word "poem." Paul selected this word carefully. The only other time in Scripture he used it was in <u>Romans 1:20</u> -- where it takes five English words to unpack poiema. All that we see, hear, touch, taste, and smell in the universe is reading God's creative masterpiece, his epic poem. Homer, Dante, Milton, and Spenser were masterful poets, as far as humans go. But at their best, their poems are merely human imaginations. However, when God imagines, his images come into real existence. His poems are living, active and multi-dimensional. " – Jon Bloom, desiringgod.org.

- a. Have you ever thought of yourself as God's poem or masterpiece? Describe why...
- **b.** What do you think those <u>good works</u> are? Discuss.
- Now, read the following verses and see if what you discussed lines up with what these Scriptures say. What do these verses say about the "good works" we are called and created to do:
 James 1:27; Romans 12:6-8; 1 Peter 4:8-11; Hebrews 13:16.
- **d.** At times, it can be confusing as to which good works God has created us to do. How could the following passages help us better understand the good works for which God has created us?
- e. How might you explain to someone that God wants us to be involved in His good works?

Application & Prayer (15min)

1. What is **ONE THING** from Sunday's Message or our Group Discussion that you will apply and practice this week? *"LORD, Help Me...Do one thing you've never done before in order to know and experience You more."* #2020 Prayer Goals

2. DECLARE the truth of Ephesians 2:10 over yourself & another person each morning this week in prayer.

3. PRAY for ONE ANOTHER: *Seek Out Opportunities to Pray for and with the People around me. #2020 Prayer Goals

*Share with your smaller group (of 3-4) and pray for the person on your right.
