restore your mission within us.


When we have been content to live in the ruins,



# **SHINE ON LEGACY: \$2,590,000**

Our rich history and presence in downtown Fargo is a beacon to the community around us. As the church and the world around us change, our building will continue to be the light on 2nd Avenue, welcoming people into God's family and grace. For 150 years, our faith family has cared for this church home, and we recognize that, to position First Presbyterian for a strong future, we must remove the burden of maintenance from future generations. This will allow them to fully commit to the daily work of the church and maximize their generosity for worship, music, faith formation, community service, and pastoral care. To accomplish this, we will establish the Shine On Legacy Endowment to support the ongoing maintenance and care of our building—the place where church life is lived out for the benefit of the community.

Gifts given through the campaign will seed this endowment. Our goal is to launch the endowment is \$2,590,000. In addition to these initial gifts, members are invited to consider including First Presbyterian Church in their comprehensive charitable estate plans.

So many have responded to our invitation for the All Congregation Event and Presentation on Sunday, April 27th. It isn't too late to join us. Our plated brunch will be provided by Heart-n-Soul Community Café . # **GOD PROVIDES - THERE IS ENOUGH**

"And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full." Matthew 14.20

All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.


