
Teach me to love thee as thine angels love, one holy passion filling all my frame; the baptism of the heaven-descended dove, my heart an altar, and thy love the flame.

Craft Kits in the Library! Come check out the new craft kits located in the church library! The EduCon committee, along with the generosity of the Library committee, have created a Wool Felting kit and two Paper Quilling kits for members to check out. Each kit contains tools, supplies, instructions and inspiration for a small group or family to learn and create a project of your choosing. Banner for Pentecost: The day of Pentecost marks the end of the Easter season. The banner for the day makes visual the Pentecost experience which is recorded in the second chapter of the book of Acts. Red, the symbol of the Holy Spirit, is the predominant color of the banner. Tongues of fire, fed by the wind of the Spirit, point to the dove. The dove recalls the Baptism of our Lord, and our own baptisms. The dove is the symbol of God's spirit resting on disciples.

Pentecost was the day when Jesus' disciples recognized the power God had bestowed on them: power to tell God's story and be heard; power to be the Body of Christ in the world.



A tri-presbytery event, called "Belonging Together," brought together a diverse group of sixth to 12th graders across the Commonwealth of Kentucky. This event served to lift up the Matthew 25 vision "to demonstrate as people of God we have a true calling to address division, exclusion and all that goes against the love of Jesus Christ in our world."

"All our events build up the body of Christ in our worship, keynote, small groups and table fellowship," said Leslee Kirkconnell, a ruling elder in the Presbytery of Western Kentucky. "This event emphasized the very real bonds we have as humans, as Christians, as Presbyterians. We learned these bonds must be nurtured and encouraged — that relationships are so important."
