 - assures the church's expression of theology remains true to the biblical standards in our historic confessions
 - serves as a symbol of unity for the church
- Publish & distribute the Book of Order, The Book of Confessions, and other General Assembly publications
- Provide a Presbyterian presence at ecumenical groups and gatherings in this country and worldwide - extending our mission efforts and our work for peace and justice far beyond what we can do by ourselves!
