*PROFESSION OF FAITH The Confession of Belhar (Excerpts from 10.7)

We believe that God has revealed God's self as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people. God, in a world full of injustice and enmity, is, in a special way, the God of the destitute, the poor, and the wronged; that God calls the church to follow God in this, for God brings justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry; God frees the prisoner and restores sight to the blind; God supports the downtrodden, protects the stranger, helps orphans and widows, and blocks the path of the ungodly. The church must therefore stand by people in any form of suffering and need, which implies, among other things, that the church must witness against and strive against any form of injustice, so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream; and that in following Christ the church must witness against all the powerful and privileged who selfishly seek their own interests.

Background: The Confession of Belhar was written in response to the sin of Apartheid in South Africa which disrupted the church's unity, created division among the children of God, and constructed unjust systems that stole life from God's creation. The church's complicity with racial separation kept Christians from worshipping and coming to the Lord's Table together. In 2016, The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) approved the Confession of Belhar as part of the Book of Confessions because it believed the clarity of Belhar's witness to unity, reconciliation, and justice might help the church speak and act with similar clarity at a time when it faces division, racism, and injustice.


