A Peek @ Next Week: We kick off the season of Advent with the Hanging of the Greens! Enjoy music from several soloists, the Sanctuary Choir, and a piano duo.

When Tears Sing: Lament as a Path to the Heart of God. This class meets today at 2:00 pm in the Social Hall. What does it mean to share one another's tears? What would happen in our church community if we became more attuned to undercurrents of grief and trauma by making space for lament? All adults are invited to explore these questions through reflection and conversation.

Hanging of the Greens: At worship next Sunday, we celebrate the *Hanging of the Greens*, which is a well-loved tradition in many churches around the country. Readings will focus on the meaning and symbolism of the different decorations that are used to adorn our worship space and/or homes during the seasons of Advent and Christmas. The Advent Wreath will be lighted for the beginning of Advent.

Unique Boutique: Due to First Link not doing the Giving Tree this year, we are going to use this opportunity to support a similar program at the YWCA called the Unique Boutique. We have eighty \$25 tags that need to be purchased. This will be a donation reflected on your giving statement. Our 80 tags will provide 20 families with Christmas gifts this season. If you would like to do your own shopping for the Unique Boutique, we encourage you to sign up to adopt a family on the YWCA website, but if not, the youth will do the shopping and wrapping for you! Tags are available for purchase in the Gathering space after worship today and next Sunday.
