

Paraments for Advent: The figure of the shepherd carries mixed symbolism for the community of faith. On the one hand, the shepherd personifies those whose lives are lived on the fringes of human community. Shepherds were not in the mainstream of society. They lived isolated lives, keeping company only with sheep and other shepherds. God chose to interrupt lives like theirs with the bright light of the Christmas star. God chose to bless people like them with the light of the world.

The color of the banner is blue, expressive of hope. Advent's hope comes not only in remembering how God became man in Jesus Christ, the hope is also in the figure of the Good Shepherd, who promised to come again to judge with love. Past, present and future come together in the blue hues of Advent and in God's startling light seen in the star and in the life and ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ.
