Trinity Banner: Alleluia! This banner celebrates Trinity. It is completely done in white and gold. The Alpha at the top and the Omega at the bottom symbolize the eternal reign of Jesus Christ. The star beneath the Alpha is a symbol of the Chi Rho, the first two letters of the Greek word Christos. The large X shaped cross in the center is the St. Andrew's cross. The shape stands for Christ's death, resurrection, life and ministry, and coming in glory. A butterfly is hidden in the cross and represents resurrection—final victory over death. Rays of light shine downward to us and symbolize Christ, the light of the world.

<u>Closing the P.O. Box this summer</u>: Please note that we will be closing our P.O. Box #327 effective June 30th. Due to rising costs and decreased levels of mail, the decision was made to close the P.O. Box and have all mail sent to the physical address.
