Your help keeps the lines of communication open and we thank you for helping us with this task.

Unique Boutique: The Unique Boutique is sponsored by the YWCA to provide Christmas gifts to the women and children living at their shelter. A gift of \$25 will purchase gifts for one person. Our goal is to provide gifts for 40 individuals (approximately 10 families). You may purchase a “tag” **this Sunday after worship**, or make your donation through the giving portal on the church’s website, noting “Unique Boutique” in the memo. Our youth will do the shopping, wrapping and delivering!

Fill a Home with Hope! The Sunday School class is collecting basic household items to provide to YWCA families who are transitioning from the shelter to a home of their own. The items needed can be found on the Volunteer Opportunities Board. As you are able and willing, please take a card item and document it on the clipboard for tracking. **Items can be returned to the green Holy Buckets anytime before December 1.**

Calling all Bakers: On Sunday, December 12, the youth will be hosting our annual cookie walk! If you’d like to donate some of your baked goods, we’d gladly accept them! To take COVID precautions, we ask that you prepackage your cookies/goodies in groups of 3-6 items in clear baggies. Please **deliver your cookies to the Jennie Roberts Room by noon on Saturday, December 11.** If you do not have a FOB to West doors, please drop off your items during office hours.

Congregational Meeting Called: After worship on Sunday, December 12, a congregational meeting has been called to review the 2021 financials, to receive the 2022 budget from Session, and to approve any changes to the terms of call for the Rev. Holtey. Summaries will be handed out at the meeting; more detailed budget info can be found in the church office that morning.

Poinsettias: It’s not too early to order your Christmas Poinsettia! You can find order forms online, at the Info Kiosk, and in the December Messenger. Orders and payments should be delivered to the office **no later than noon on December 13.** Please write a separate check for your poinsettia; do not include with your offering.

A Christmas Ring and Sing-along: This FREE concert on **Monday, December 13 at 7:00 pm** is presented by the FM Area Music Club. Several area organists; the women’s choir, The Noteables; and the handbell choir, BELLissimo, are participating in this family-friendly event with narration from Pastor Mary. FPC is well-represented in the membership of these groups!

ManUP: ManUP, a men’s Bible study, kicks off its monthly sessions on **December 14 at 6:45 am via ZOOM.** The group meets on the second Tuesday of each month, October-May. Intended to help men understand what the Bible says in relation to what is expected of a Christian man, the study this year examines the Epistle to the Hebrews. No advance preparation is required for each month’s study.

PW News: PW Board meets via ZOOM on Tuesday, **December 14 at 10:00 am.** There is no General Meeting this month. Also via ZOOM, the PW Bible Study, held Tuesday, **December 21 at 2:00 pm,** will focus on Lesson 4, "Ruth and Loyal Love," led by Pastor Holtey. Our November study was enjoyed by 19.

So far this year, our PW YWCA rep has delivered 507 pillows for use by those in need at the Y. Last month, 54 rolls of paper towels and 33 shampoo/conditioners were delivered. For December, we will collect aspirin, Tylenol, ibuprofen, etc. Please place your donations in the YWCA bin in the coat room.

We will also be collecting winter items for men - such as winter hats, hand warmers, winter gloves, long underwear, and water bottles in the New Life Center bin.

New Pilgrimage Class: January’s Pilgrimage class is new and meant for current participants and FPC congregants who may be interested in becoming part of The Pilgrimage ministry. Titled, *Seeking God Together*, the 2-session class will provide small group experience steeped in contemplative Christian tradition. Kit O’Neill will teach the class with current pilgrim guides as small group facilitators. Recommended reading for the class is, *The Pilgrim’s Compass*, by Paul H.
