

<u>Festival of Trees:</u> This year's Missions will include the Mitten Tree & Sox Box, the Food Tree, the Toothbrush Tree, and new this year, **the Rainbow Bridge Tree**. Rainbow Bridge is the only Safe Exchange/Supervised Parenting Time Center in the FM area. These are tags on the tree for you to take: **items for Gingerbread Houses:** Graham crackers, candy, frosting, gingerbread kits; **Cookie Decorating Supplies:** packages of 6 sugar cookies, frosting, decorations; **gift cards** for parents to buy gifts for their children; **monetary contributions** for staff to enhance the holiday experience for families. Visit the trees in the west foyer for further details on ALL these mission opportunities.

Wi-Fi: Wi-Fi is available throughout the church. (password: community650)


